

Tokyo 2020



Tokyo is the capital of Japan and home to 12 million+ people. It's vast! Don't think of it as a single city, but a constellation of cities that have grown together. The main roads are clogged with cars, and first impression is of an urban nightmare, look further and you'll find tranquil backstreets, old world wooden houses with bonsai trees; hi-tech shops alongside charming fragments of the old city, timeless temples and shrines. Central Tokyo, is awash with chic shopping streets, its financial centre and the major train station, plus enough bars and restaurants to last a lifetime.

The Japanese College is just a short walk from Shinjuku Station and overlooks the Hanazono Shrine. Despite being in the centre of the busiest part of Japan, the school's location is peaceful and relaxing, a perfect environment to learn Japanese language and culture.

Standard Course

20 lessons per week
Class size: max 8 people
Ideal for all age groups and language abilities.
Core classes concentrate on communication skills, across all language levels, with emphasis on real-life skills.

Languages for Life Course

As Standard Course but only open to students able to extend beyond 90 day tourist visa regulations.

Standard & Conversation Course

As Standard Course + conversational classes (extra 5 lessons per week) focusing on slang, dialects, specialized vocabulary, and more. Not open to Beginner levels.

JLPT Preparation

General Japanese group tuition + private tuition lessons, generally leading up to December exam

Japanese & Traditional Culture

As Standard course + Saturday activities
Up to 4 weeks duration
Class size: max 8 people
Learn about the culture whilst still learning the language. Topics covered: kimono, ceramics, tea ceremony, calligraphy, flower arranging, Japanese cookery, dance and theatre, military arts (e.g. aikido), religion/spirituality, customs.

Japanese & Pop-Culture

Up to 4 weeks duration
As Standard Course + Saturday activities + learn the language as it is really spoken today. You will study Japanese through movies and TV shows, listening to music, and reading manga and modern fiction and non-fiction writing.

Visa rules:

If you are an EU or US citizen, courses up to 12 weeks duration only require a tourist visa. If of another nationality or you require a longer course please discuss with CESA.

Tokyo Weather:

Summers are usually hot and humid with a temperature range of about 20-30 °C, though it can sometimes climb into the high thirties. Winters are usually mild, with temperatures generally ranging from 0-10 °C, though occasional cold spells can send temperatures plummeting below zero at night. Snow is rare, but on those rare occasions Tokyo is hit by a snowstorm, much of the train network grinds to a halt. The famous cherry blossoms bloom in March-April and parks, most famously Ueno, fill up with locals enjoying the blossom.

To do list:

- ~ Eat a sushi breakfast at the Tsukiji Fish Market
- ~ Take a boat ride on the Sumida River from Asakusa
- ~ Lose yourself in the dazzling neon jungle outside major train stations in the evenings. Shibuya and east Shinjuku at night
- ~ Enjoy a soak in a local "sento" or public bath
- ~ Take the Yurikamome elevated train across the bay bridge from Shimbashi station to the bayside Odaiba district, and go on the giant ferris wheel
- ~ Watch a baseball game at the Tokyo Dome or at Jingu Stadium
- ~ Take a stroll through the Imperial Palace's East Gardens
- ~ Enjoy a weekend afternoon in Yoyogi Park, where young people from all walks of life gather to socialize and practice their hobbies
