

Art History Course Florence 2024



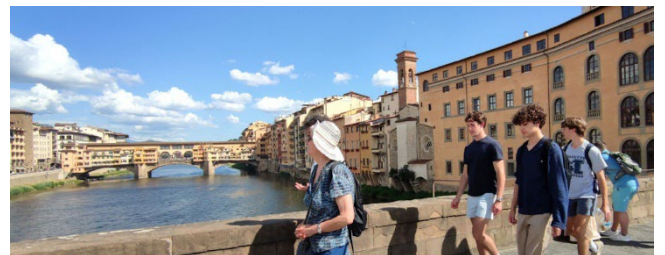
If you are fascinated by the beauty of Italian Art and want to explore the riches of this Florentine heritage, viewing these treasures in person, the History of Italian Art course will allow you to learn in depth about the history and social context in which a wide range of masterpieces were designed and executed.

The course is designed to show, through both slides and guided visits, the development of art in Italy in relation to the rest of Europe and offers you an introduction to the most important artistic styles (Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque).

You will become acquainted with the most important works of artists such as Botticelli, Leonardo, Raphael and Michelangelo while learning about the most significant historical and social events that accompanied them. The programme contains a general overview of Florentine Art History and then a tailored study of a specific aspect of Florence's Art History story.

Duration: One or two weeks
Levels: Elementary/A2 level+
No beginners
Lessons: 06 classes per week
Course: Additional to Italian classes

The History of Art Course in Florence consists of classroom sessions, as well as on-site visits across the city. The course begins in the classroom, using texts, slides, illustrations and maps to introduce the history of Florence as explored through the Art of the time, and its development through the work of a variety of the Italian Masters.
