Fukuoka

Must sees include the modern Kyushu National Museum (Japanese artefacts) ~ the Asian Art Museum ~ Hakata-za, Fukuoka's famous "kabuki" theatre ~ free Noh and Kabuki performances in the Ohori Park Noh theatre ~ for night birds enjoy the huge variety of venues, for everything from a cup of 'sake' with friends in a quiet 'izakaya' to a crazy night of dancing at a top club ~ Izakayas (Japanese pubs) exist on virtually every corner ~ try a 'shochu' (a spirit made from either rice, wheat, barley or potato) or some 'sashimi' (raw fish) and you could easily be mistaken for a local.



CESA Plus Points:

Nakoya

Nagoya is the 3rd largest city in Japan, at the heart of Aichi prefecture. Home to Oda Nobunaga, Toyotomi Hideyoshi and Tokugawa Ieyasu. The city is the manufacturing and shipping hub of central Honshu island. It is not a classic tourist destination though the Toyota Tecno Museum is located here and the medieval Castle is a huge draw. There is much to discover in the metropolitan centre and the surrounding smaller towns, so provides a wonderful place for Japanese language course immersion.



CESA Plus Points:

Tokyo:

Don't get too hung up on ticking tourist sights off your list: for most visitors, the biggest part of the Tokyo experience is just wandering around at random and absorbing the vibe, poking your head into shops selling weird and wonderful things, sampling restaurants where you can't recognize a single thing on the menu (or on your plate), and finding an unexpected oasis of calm in the tranquil grounds of a neighbourhood Shinto shrine. It's all surprisingly safe, and the locals will go to extraordinary lengths to help you if you just ask. Shinjuku: Home to luxury hotels, giant camera stores, futuristic skyscrapers, hundreds of shops and restaurants.



CESA Plus Points:

Kyoto

Kyoto is known as the thousand-year capital, the historic seat of the Imperial Emperors until 1869. It is home to 1.5 million+ people. The city is home to a busy business centre, many revered Universities, and a very modern major train station. The ancient and the modern sit side by side here, historic temples, shrines and palaces, modern skyscrapers multi landed highways and quiet backstreets with, old world wooden houses.

There is a large university student population (over 20 universities in the city) and it's a very popular tourist destination. It offers history, fine cuisine and a lively Arts scene.



Public holidays in Japan 2025

On public holidays, lessons are not held (and are replaced by the school by an activity or excursion) and if this coincides with a start date, the assessment tests and registration may take place on Tuesday instead.

2025: 01 & 13 Jan, 11 & 24 Feb, 20 Mar, 29 Apr, 05 & 06 May, 21 Jul, 11 Aug, 15 & 23 Sept, 13 Oct, 03 & 24 Nov 2026: to be confirmed. Christmas closure: Week of 29th December 2025.



Student Visa Criteria

- Must have completed High School (and have proof of graduation) and 150 hrs of accredited Japanese language study or JLPT Level 5, alternatively you must be a recent University graduate (but no more than 4 yrs ago) and any level, beginner+
- Must have proof of employment (if working) or of further study (if at or going to University/Further Education)
- Must show bank statements as proof that you (or financial sponsor) have funds to pay for tuition & living expenses for a full year
- Must have no criminal record, and never have been denied a visa for Japan previously
- Depending on your nationality, there may be additional requirements.

Enrolment procedure:

Please book with CESA Languages as early as possible, places book up months in advance!. The school will forward the student visa application form with a list of documents required and detailed instructions.

Dates quoted are Japanese Immigration deadlines for application, not arranged by the language school.

Working Holiday Visa

The Working Holiday Visa is ONLY offered to the following nationals:

Australians, New Zealanders, Canadians, Koreans, French, Germans, British, Irish, Danish, Norwegian, Portuguese, Polish, Taiwanese and Hong Kong citizens.

If you are not on the list you must either apply for a Student Visa (only offered if applying for an Academic Year course in Fukuoka or Nagoya) or be eligible for a visa waiver.

Criteria:

You must be a national on the list quoted above

You must be between 19 and 30 yrs of age

You must be able to show proof of minimum funds (around \$2000.00 plus have a return flight ticket home)

You must be in good health

You must NOT have been issued a Japanese Working holiday visa previously

Visa Waiver / Tourist Entry

The Visa Waiver arrangement works very well for UK, USA and EU citizens (amongst others). Students must respect the period allowed for their nationality, but it means you can travel and study without needing to complete any visa paperwork.

Generally students can stay in Japan on this basis for a 02 to 180 days period. No exceptions can be made to the rules laid down by Japanese Immigration.

No application deadline applied

Available for shorter term courses only – maximum 180 days (depending on your nationality)

On arrival in Japan you will be given a 90-day landing permission. If you plan on spending longer than 90 days in Japan you will need to leave the country (most students take the short flight to South Korea) spend a night and then return to Japan to renew your 90 days stay permission.

JLPT Exam Preparation

So you can speak Japanese.
Can you prove it?

The recognised proof of Japanese linguistic ability is the JLPT Exams, accredited by the Ministry of Education.

Students can sit the exam in December.

It is a perfect supplement to a long-term programme.

(paid to the Exam board, not the language school)
