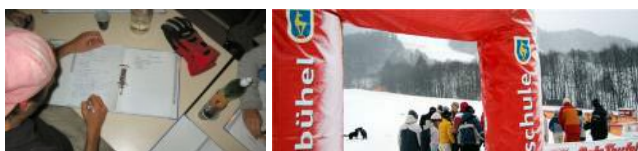

Kitzbühel is a lively location to learn German in, with plenty of action for the energetically minded language student, throughout the year. It appeals to CESA Language students who wish to combine their German language studies with skiing or hiking and enjoying the wonderful mountain scenery. German language students can follow a short-term language programme from one week plus, which makes it a perfect get away programme, for those with work ties.

The German language classes are taught in a Sport Centre, set in a leafy suburb of the town, a 15-minute walk from the centre. It is a small school with a personal atmosphere and an ideal location to study German. Class sizes and student numbers are always small – so there is plenty of opportunity for everyone to practise their language skills! Based in a convenient location, with plenty of accommodation for students, supermarkets, large sports equipment and clothing stores, pubs restaurant and a bank within 5 minutes walking distance.

Kitzbühel is somewhere to relax and enjoy; the air is clean and fresh and the people are hospitable and charming. The skiing and snow boarding opportunities are ideal for the whole skiing season (with glacier skiing when the snow doesn't want to play) and hiking in the summer is idyllic!
