Is this the course for you?

Yes. If you're looking for an immersion French course, staying with local French hosts. It's perfect for older teenagers looking to work on their French, in a teenage only study environment (by the sea) with other language students from across Europe. Students really enjoy living on the Atlantic coast, in Biarritz.

The courses are popular ~ so early reservations are advised!

French & Surf Course & host accommodation

20 French language lessons per week
+ 4 afternoons of surf instruction (surf lessons times dependent on the tides)
Surfing lessons take place in Anglet
Students are driven to the beach by language school staff and back to the school after the session
Wetsuits and boards provided
8 students per surfing group/instructor
Maximum 14 students per French level
Social activities, excursions and one evening event are included in the programme

Please note: French tuition can be booked as a stand-alone course, only if parents are also in Biarritz to take legal responsibility of the student/s.

French Course Notes

Prior to arrival students will be asked to complete a level test
On the first Monday of a course, students have an Induction Talk. French classes will always start on Monday at 10.10 hrs through to 12.30 hrs
Tuesday to Friday classes are held 09.00 hrs to 12.30 hrs (with a 20-minute break)
So, there are 15 hours (or 20 lessons x 45 minutes) in total per week (no homework is set).

The programme covers all the different elements of the French language. Students are taught a wide range of language learning tools; covering speaking, reading, writing and listening skills according to their current French language level.

The main focus of the course is always oral communication and the teachers are all university educated, native speakers. Students are always encouraged to participate actively in class and to put their new-found French skills into practice.

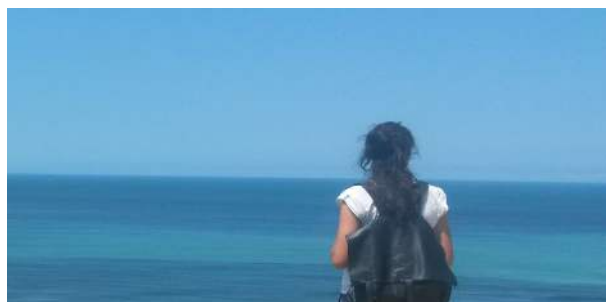
Language School:

In **June** the school welcomes between 15 to 25 students per week and classes are held in the main school building, used year-round for adult courses. The school is in a typical Basque house in a central area.

In **July and early August**, the school expects to host between 40 to 60 students in any one week and teenagers may be taught in a separate building, not the main school.

Teenage Students:

Most teenagers come from Western Europe – specifically Spain, Germany and Switzerland. With additional students from Russia, America, Japan, Ireland and the UK. Of course, every teenager is welcome, whatever their nationality.

- ~ Picnic lunch (supplied by hosts)
- ~ Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri: Surfing sessions

Surf sessions:

1.5hrs duration. Supervision ratio of 1 member of staff to 8 students

Timetable will vary depending on tides and weather conditions – staff will advise the students once in Biarritz

Fully qualified instructors at the partner surf school

Lessons adapted to the needs and levels of the participants; groups of 8 students maximum

Activity sessions:

Supervision ratio of 1 member of staff to 12 students (8 students for surfing)

Each activity is supervised by qualified professionals or a school representative

Activities: football tournaments, beach volley competitions, quizzes, photo competitions, treasure hunts.



Extra Activities:

The school staff arrange a variety of **additional activities** aside from the Surfing programme each week, including; football tournaments, beach volley competitions, quizzes, photo competitions, treasure hunts on Wednesday afternoon (half-day) and Saturday.

The activities are a great way to get to know each other and of course to practise your French, outside of the formal class sessions!

Students are accompanied by school staff, to encourage a little more French conversation wherever possible.



Ready to enrol?

Please complete the enrolment form online at www.cesalanguages.com or call the CESA office and we can enrol the students over the phone. On receipt, we will enrol you on the course and send confirmation of your booking.

CESA recommends students enrol as early as possible, and no later than THREE weeks before the beginning of the course. A deposit of €300.00 or £250.00 is required at the time of booking (or full fees if enrolling close to the start date).

Accommodation

French hosts/ess based (private household)

Offered on a shared room basis (either with a friend or the college will find another student for you to share with) with full-board (breakfast and evening meals every day and Sunday lunch + picnic lunch on other days) arranged by the hosts.

Hosts offer either one twin room or in a few cases, two or three, twin rooms.

French hosts live in and around Biarritz, Bayonne and Anglet - in houses generally a bus ride from the language school (expect a journey of 25/30 minutes by bus).

Bus pass: Allow €40.00 per week

Please note some buses stop running in Biarritz around 8/9pm (3 lines run all night), so students staying out later may have to walk or take a taxi back to their hosts.

Students are expected to keep their bedroom tidy and may be asked to clean the room. Hosts provide bed linen, but students should bring their own towel. The bedrooms have storage space, a workspace, a lamp and a window.

Hosts offer you the chance to share daily French life with native speakers. They may well have more than two students staying with them.

They will collect you from Biarritz airport/station by arrangement, free of charge (if at a reasonable hour) and take you back at the end of the course.

They will also show their students to college on the first Monday of their course. Sundays are spent with your hosts, so that they can enjoy your company and may even take you out for the day or go to the beach with you (though this isn't compulsory).

Travel directions:

Arrive: **Sunday** Depart: **Saturday AM**

Travel to Biarritz by plane (or train) and then take the host arranged two-way transfer to your accommodation.

Going Out Permission:

Teenagers aged 15/17 years old will need a signed parental permission form to be able to go out in the evenings **up to 23.00hrs** during the week and **01.00hrs on Friday/Saturday**, or nights before public holidays otherwise students are NOT allowed out in the evenings, after the evening meal.

Parents of 15 yr olds will need to send in an additional letter of authorisation to enable the students to out in the evening.

NB: Parents cannot set alternative curfews, as the school staff are unable to police them.
