



German A' level Revision

Berlin 2026





This German A-level revision course is offered to help firstand second-year A level German language students overcome linguistic weaknesses, develop the confidence to communicate effectively in German and to put their German language knowledge into practice.

The course aims to significantly increase spoken confidence and written skills.

Students can polish up general German language skills including revision of grammar structures and pronunciation and address any linguistic weaknesses. Tutors are all native speakers who are also professional teachers of German as a foreign language.

A level Revision Course Content:

20 group lessons of general language tuition

+ 10 private lessons tailored to A level course requirements

One lesson: 45 minutes

Max 12 students per group class

Offered to A level (or Int Bac or Highers) students currently in Yr 12/13 of school education, with group lessons held in open group classes (all ages accepted)

Language skills covered: Grammar exercises, Oral and written expression, Aural and written comprehension, Phonetics, vocabulary and syntax.

Please note this is a German language, not a literature orientated programme.

Group lessons are offered across six different language levels at the school (from beginner to advance) and are open to all age groups.

A level students are assigned to one of the intermediate level general German classes, based on a short assessment test. Lessons are taught in tandem, with two native German teachers responsible for every class, and alternating at every break. In this way students get to hear more than one voice and speaking style.

Private lessons deal with A level topics and areas of specific relevance to the individual student. Please let CESA know of any particular areas of interest or need, when enrolling on the course.

A level Topics: We ask that each student tells us which topics they need to prepare for their A level oral exam. These topics will be incorporated into the private tuition sessions during the week. Please send in your Topic information (CESA will supply a form) as early as you can and no later than 2 weeks before the course begins.

Accommodation

You will be placed in a single room with a hostess, on a half-board basis. Half-board accommodation generally involves a commute across Berlin (allow 30 to 50 mins).

German A 'level Revision Course Notes

College Description:

Berlin is a dynamic city, and there is plenty to see and experience, besides the studious environment of the language school. The combination of its academic record, great city location and ease of access via its international airport, makes it the perfect study location.

Meals:

The guides can show you see some of the better-known attractions such as the **Reichstag**, **Brandenburger Tor**, the **National Gallery** or the **Check Point Charlie museum** (with a college guide) but also exploring the hidden corners of Berlin that the average tourist never gets to see. Students are asked to pay entrance fees and public transport tickets etc but not for the guide.

Private study:

Students will be asked to complete some homework tasks each night in preparation for the following day's classes. It is important that students complete these tasks to take full advantage of the week's programme.
